

Lindsay to at least permit the discussion of an alternative. Senator Lindsay representing another faction of pro-769 supporters. I think they've had some discussion with some of the traditional opponents of 769, among them Senator Ashford, Senator Bernard-Stevens, and together those two have agreed that they would support, I believe, if I understand that correctly, an amendment that expanded the terms of 769. The next camp is me, (laugh), and that is to say, if you have ever watched here, I don't know if you've seen this or not, I haven't tried to make it anybody's agenda, but I have offered four amendments, one to an amendment to 769. I've never offered one directly to LB 769. I've offered three to 688. They are all matters of substance, they all are germane to the bill. None of them are procedural motions. I have done two things, number one, I have filed those motions, and they're all substantive, and they all relate to the topic of the bill. And, secondly, I have spoken at every occasion afforded to me by the rules, but no more. I have not created those, other than to introduce those substantive resolutions...amendments, rather. I do not wish to see change in Nebraska public policy on abortion.

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: That is my position. I'm against LB 769, I'm against it in the amended form. There is, however, sort of a truth in lending kind of a proposal. I don't mind the idea of having before us the amendment to 769 to talk about, because that is what we've been talking about all afternoon long. I have no difficulty if, in fact, that is ahead, so long as I don't lose the procedural right to make the arguments that I want to with respect to that measure. The fifth camp, I believe however, is Senator Chambers who would just as soon not have that amendment take its place ahead of the preexisting resolutions or amendments, rather, and who may resist that. I will tell you what my position here is. My position is I'm against 769, I'm against the suggested or newly drafted amendment to LB 769. I am not against the idea of having that issue before us so long as it is ahead of but not belated to all those motions to suspend the rules that Senator Labeledz has, and all those motions to...
