But I don't think any simple crafted amendments that we do here can address that problem, because it's a problem of society, it's the way society works or doesn't work. And, if we could craft a simple amendment here to affect it, then we could simply put an amendment up that would eliminate all our problems, or a bill possibly that says you will be good parents, you will raise your children correctly, and you children will learn your moral lessons, and you will go and do only the things your parents want. We could pass that sort of bill, and then we wouldn't have that...the problems that we face today. But, unfortunately, that's not very realistic. So I don't really know if any sort of amendments to LB 769 can make myself comfortable with it, but I guess I'm always open to listen to see what people come up with. Thank you.
