

things that can break through and stimulate that part of our brain where curiosity resides. I wish Tim was here. He's been advocating that we use this bill to incorporate into our practices some of the tactics used in Parliament where you can boo and hiss and holler at people. And I agreed with him. But if Senator Kristensen would attempt to do such a thing, I would point to the rule that says you shall not speak to or address another member who is presently on the floor speaking unless that person yields. So I would tell the Speaker to ask you to lean your head over within striking distance and he put wood to wood and bring you in order, Senator Kristensen. But, at any rate, the discussion today has been of the kind that has dealt with the serious issues. But there hasn't been the rancor, there hasn't been the divisiveness. There has...there has been a kind of...Dave's not here so I'll say it for him, there's been a kind of collegial atmosphere. There is a sense of resignation here. There is a sense of expectancy. There is a sense of questioning. Will we indeed be here until midnight? We're more than halfway home. We don't have a lot of miles to walk or a lot of work to do before we can sleep. And we can sleep the sleep of the righteous when we go home tonight and have done no damage that had not been done prior to our coming here.

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We will enjoy, Senator Kristensen, sleep, the innocent sleep, sleep that knits up the raveled sleeve of care. Oh, he's gone to sleep already. (Laughter.) Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, we ought to go ahead and bracket this bill and even though the motion says until January 1st of 1991, we can make a motion subsequent to today, prior to the expiration of the session to unbracket this bill and read it in its present form on Final Reading. To add other types of things could run the risk of putting two subjects in one bill. If that should be done and the bill happens to be advanced, which I think it can be prevented from doing, but if that should happen and it's found that there are two subjects and the bill would be unconstitutional, neither side would gain but there would not be enough time to return it to Select File, strike the amendment and readvance it to Final Reading with enough time to read it. So I hope you will see the wisdom of this motion and vote in the affirmative.
