SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Abboud. Senator Abboud, you moved the previous question, did you?

SENATOR ABBOUD: Yes, I did.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Are there five hands? I do. Thank you. Shall debate cease? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I object. I don't feel that there was sufficient debate.

SPEAKER BARRETT: In the opinion of the Chair, debate had been full and fair.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I challenge that ruling.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Mr. President, I would like to withdraw that motion.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. It is withdrawn. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think since the Chair accepted Senator Abboud's motion and acted on it that he cannot now withdraw it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Abboud, do you have a comment?

SENATOR ABBOUD: Well, Mr. President, I made the motion and no one objected and you accepted my motion to or my withdrawal. Mr. President, I believe Senator Chambers was late in his objection to my motion to withdraw.

SPEAKER BARRETT: In terms of the motion to overrule the Chair, we do have three lights remaining and, of course, anybody can speak one time to that motion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I want to be clear on this. You are saying that even though when the question had been called and you asked for the five hands that the issue was still open for additional action? In other words, you are saying what you did does not constitute action on his call of the question,
