PRESIDENT: Yes, that's correct.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the agenda be overruled? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Lamb, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, to save time, I would ask that there be a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: All right, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 1 may, to go under call, Mr. President.

And the house is under call. Please remain in your PRESIDENT: seats and, those that are not in the chamber, please return to the chamber and record your presence. The house is under call. Looking for Senator Lindsay, Senator Lynch, Senator Landis, Senator Ashford, Senator Baack, Senator McFarland, Weihing, Senator Wesely, Senator Scofield, Senator Schmit. We're looking for Senator McFarland now. Senator McFarland will be here in a moment. Senator McFarland is here and the question, ladies and gentlemen, is, shall the agenda Roll call vote has been requested. overruled? Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1788 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Changing from "yes" to "not voting".

CLERK: 25 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a priority motion. Senator Lamb would move to reconsider the vote just taken on overruling the agenda.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Senator Lamb, please. The call is raised.
