But my question is just one of my own, Don, that doesn't have anything to do with any axes to grind for the administration or anything like that, it's just my own feeling. I want to be sure, as I read through the bill, which I did...I read through it last Friday again when we were spending so much time on one other subject (laughter), there are housing projects that are geared to the elderly, and the density is such because they have no families. This does not supersede or overcome any of that, right? Senator Wesely, can you...
