Regents would be residents of this state. I suspect that we would expect that to be true regardless, but nevertheless, it was not a part of the constitutional amendment and that certainly would be something everyone would expect. Then there is one change that does make a change in a number of Board of Trustees possible. The Education Committee amendment which was adopted reduced the number from seven down to five and then, along with the provision of a student member, voting member which was added on the floor, would make the total six and what the amendment does is clarifies a range of five to seven to be determined by statute and then at least the next session may want to consider an odd number if the student is selected and then you would need to be able to go to seven. If the student is not approved, student voting member is not approved, why then, obviously, it could remain at five, but it does give that option. And then it does point out that the student member, however, on the Board of Trustees would not necessarily have to be a resident of the state and, obviously, there could be a student elected as a president of the student group that would be a resident of a state other than Nebraska, but it would permit them to serve in their capacity as a president of the student body, so those are the three, or those are the amendments. If anyone wishes to have any of them considered separately, why I would certainly have no objection, otherwise I'd move their adoption.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Landis, please. Senator Schmit, please. Senator Warner, did you wish to close on your...? The question, ladies and gentlemen, is the Warner amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the Warner amendment, ladies and gentlemen. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, Mr. President, I guess I'll ask for a call of the house just to get enough members in. Call in votes are fine.

PRESIDENT: Okay, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 6 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor and please return to your seats. Please
