There were a lot of points I would have liked to have made because I have severe reservations about the entire amendment in itself. Senator Chambers, Senator Schimek today have also raised those reservations. I appreciate Senator Elmer's comment. I think it is time to move on. There is just not sufficient support to get this bill on the ballot and I think it's appropriate at this time to bracket the bill and move on to other things. And if we don't, then we can debate it and we can be here for another hour, or two hours, or three hours and I...as long as it takes, I guess. But I'm offering the legislative body a chance to move on, a chance to see that this bill doesn't have the sufficient support of 30 members of this body to pass, and to go ahead with the other important bills and other important legislation that we need to consider. Before we take a vote, I'd ask for a call of the house at this time and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is, shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 2 nays, to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please return to your desks and record your presence. Those members outside the chamber, please return. The house is under call. Senator Byars, please. Senators Hall, Hannibal, Hefner, Rod Johnson. Senator Pirsch, Senator Bernard-Stevens, the house is under call. Senators Hefner and Pirsch, the house is under call. Members, return to your seats for a roll call vote on the motion to bracket the bill until April 9, 1990. May we proceed, Senator McFarland? Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR McFARLAND: Is she on her way? She went to the doctor's office? I guess we could go ahead, Mr. Speaker. That would be all right with me.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. (Gavel.) Members, return to your seats for roll call vote.

SENATOR McFARLAND: (Microphone not on.) ...bill before we vote, or read the motion. (Laugh.) Read the motion, what the bracket motion says.
