SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I will ask for a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is, shall the house be under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 1 may to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Looking for Senator Landis, Senator Langford, Senator Lindsay, Senator Moore, Senator Scofield, Senator Elmer, Senator Goodrich, Senator Haberman, Senator Hannibal. Senator Chambers, did you ask for a roll call vote? I didn't hear you. You will ask for a roll call vote, okay. Looking for Senator Lynch. Senator Lynch is excused. We are looking for Senator McFarland and here he is, and that is it. The question, ladies and gentlemen, is the adoption of the Schimek amendment. Roll call is requested. Please hold your conversation down so the Clerk can hear your response. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1807-08 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the resolution at this time, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, we are ready to advance the bill. The call is raised. Senator Withem, are you going to talk about advancing the bill?

SENATOR WITHEM: I would but I think I would prefer...it seems like there is something on the bill, so let's take up the amendment and then we will...

PRESIDENT: There is an amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend.
