SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please return to your seats and record your presence. Call in votes have been authorized. Senator Bernard-Stevens, please. Senator Schmit. Senator Landis. Senator Hannibal, the house is under call. Call in votes have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator McFarland voting yes. Senator Robak voting yes.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Roll call vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Roll call vote has been requested. Members will return to their seats for a roll call vote. Mr. Clerk, on the motion to suspend the rules and move the bills to Select File. Proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 1819-20 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion prevails. The call is raised. Any items to read in? Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a priority motion. Senator Chambers would move to reconsider the suspension motion as offered by Senators Labedz and Schmit.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I know there is no chance for this motion to be adopted, because it would take 25 votes. But I want to give those who voted on that other one the opportunity to do it twice, so that it's clear that they intended to do just what they did. So, that will be my opening, and we can proceed from here.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion of the reconsideration of the suspension motion? Senator Labedz.
