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that have become individual senator priority bills. I thank Senator Barrett for the leadership he is showing in putting this proposal forward. I think it is the correct thing to do. I think we started this morning for breaking the logjam by the motion we made this morning. Frankly, that was a very hard vote for me but I thought it was necessary to break some of the logjam or all of the log-jam that we had on General File. We have a logjam on Select File, we also have a logjam on Final Reading. So I think extraordinary steps are needed and I think what Senator Barrett is bringing you is a good proposal and I would urge the 30 senators necessary to vote in support of this.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, as I stated this morning, I'm in opposition to the motion from the Speaker, and I can understand why he is offering it and he stated very clearly what he perceives his job as Speaker to be. But that doesn't sway me at all from my feeling that these bills ought to be open for handling as we always do bills on Final Reading. Some of them moved over and there was discussion of the possibility of dealing with them on Final Reading. One was a judge bill, the one that would put the two judges, and I know the two judges are not needed. And there would have been some discussion between me and some of the supporters of this bill which would establish that fact for the body. And to say that in the interest of reading these bills just to read them, that serious measures are going to be slid through the system without the consideration they should get, even at this point, is a mistake, in my opinion. I would like to mention two things to the Speaker. First of all, I would like to ask a question so that I'm clear. Senator Barrett, did you mention a bill of Senator Abboud that did not get on the list?

PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Yes, I did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you apologized for that?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: First of all, you don't have to apologize. I'm just having fun, Chris; keeping the mood light. But I really mean that if it's what I'm thinking of. But,
