

distribution formula on LB 1059 from a forecasted amount to going back to two years prior actual income liability in the district?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yeah, we did, and that's a fairly technical amendment that the Department of Revenue people told us that we needed and, frankly, to ask for an off the top of my head explanation of the difference between those two figures, it's not a major change, it just deals with the manner in which the Department of Revenue does their work.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I have been led to believe that there is as much as a \$10 million difference as to how the \$10 million gets distributed if it's used as an income tax credit back to the district versus an equalization type of \$10 million. I'm afraid I'm going to lose my time here but I would like to put my light back on. I hope I have a chance to talk further on this. If for some reason I don't, I certainly would say we have a lot of things to discuss, in my mind, and I would like to not support the suspension motion.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. I would like to yield my time to Senator Hannibal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hannibal, please.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. If I might go on, and thank you, Senator Withem, for your forthrightness. LB 1059 has been...is a major bill and with all major bills there are things that need to be worked out and come up with. I'm not so sure that 1059 is the best bill we could have. I have not made any falsities in my impressions on that. I have been opposed to it for which I have been roundly criticized by a number of different constituency groups, which is fine, they certainly have that right. And I do understand that there is many things involved with LB 1059 and there are some good things that Senator Lamb, I think, has expressed it many times that that bill has a lot of good things in it, and I agree with him a 100 percent. I'm not sure that it's been totally thought out and I'm going to sound like sour grapes here by saying we don't want to pass 1059. But, again, remember if this motion passes, we aren't going to have a chance to talk anymore on 1059. I will be certainly putting a red vote up there but I want to take
