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important piece of legislation for this body to deal with prior to adjourning. And I assume that will be special ordered if it doesn't come up on its own. But other than that I don't have a strong special interest. It just appears to me as the more significant pieces of legislation are probably sitting on Select File now as opposed to committee priority bills so I'll be supporting the motion.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I'm mulling over what Senator Hall had to say and to a large degree it makes a lot of sense. I guess I just wanted to throw out the idea that on committee priority bills a lot of those bills have already been incorporated into other bills. I go back and look through and I don't particularly see, though, certainly I'm not an expert on all the bills that are there, I don't see any major controversy. I would I guess suggest that if by some miracle or by some stroke of luck we're able to get through Select File on a log...get through the logjam at some point it would be nice to be able to have those other bills to be able to be voice voted on Select File over to Final Reading. And I don't really see where the committee priority bills will take that much time. And it would simply be an idea that if we do get across on Select File, we do get through the bills on Select File, most of these if we could move them over to Select File could be very easily moved on to Final Reading. And it just gives us another option to think about. I don't see us taking that much time on the General File committee priority bills, although I may be mistaken. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Hefner, please.

SENATOR HEFNER: Question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. That won't be necessary. There are no other lights on. Senator Hall, would you like to close on your motion?

SENATOR HALL: Only, Mr. Speaker, in asking that we...the motion takes 30 votes. I would appreciate the support of the body to do this. We're going to be here, if we're going to be here, I would hope that we could use the time productively.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question is the overrule of the agenda
