positions and all of a sudden be able to say, no, I am sorry, we can't do that. We are going to have to appoint someone that is not as good, that doesn't have the background or the experience, may not even have the drive to do what you want to do, to make the sacrifice necessary to do all of these things at the low pay because you are of the wrong party. And I think those are areas that we need not get into when we make educational policy. Those are political discussions and political things. As Senator Warner said the other day, not that politics does not interfere and come into play on educational policy, it certainly does every day, but this is one that we can control, that there is no particular need for, and I would urge the adoption of the amendment by Senator Chambers. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Hall, please.

SENATOR HALL: Question.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, that won't be necessary, but appreciate it anyway. Senator Chambers, would you like to close on your motion?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Mr. Chairman, and members of the Legislature, the amendment is not difficult to understand at all in terms of what it does, but I would just say briefly again the rationale is that I don't believe we ought to make reference to this idea of three members, no more than three members of the appointing Governor's party being one of these board members, if that is not going to be carried throughout the appointive process forever. So I hope that you will consider those arguments that have been given and adopt this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Oh, record, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chambers amendment is adopted. Anything further on it, Mr. Clerk?
