SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think I will leave well enough alone.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to the constitutional amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chambers amendment is adopted. May I introduce some guests, please. Senator Barrett has some guests under the south balcony. The Mayor of Gothenburg, Nebraska, Eldon Lepp, and his wife, Elaine. Would you please stand and be recognized? Thank you. Senator Bernard-Stevens has some guests under the north balcony. (Journal shows FFA Group.) They are with the Stapleton Public Schools. Would you folks...the FHA (sic), I should say...would you folks please stand and be recognized. Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, your light is on. Did you wish recognition? Nothing before the house.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman,...oh, aren't you going to make a motion to move the bill?

PRESIDENT: Okay, there is a motion to advance the resolution, I guess. Go ahead. Senator Withem, did you wish to speak first?

SENATOR WITHEM: No, I would make a motion that the bill be advanced. I think we had a good lively discussion on the bracket motion. I would prefer that we...save most of my remarks for closing, and just encourage people to make comments. I'll put my light on, if there appears to be anything I need to respond to. But, with that, I'd just move that the bill be advanced.
