We have a Postsecondary Coordinating We tend to ignore their recommendations. indicated before, there is something known as the Council on Public Higher Education, a voluntary coordinating body that hasn't met in two years now, and has only now met that this proposal is coming up. I think the fact... Senator Moore brought up an interesting point concerning the Appropriations Committee. It's no secret, I guess, that the Appropriations Committee has more direct contact with higher education than anybody else in this Legislature, including the Education Committee. We don't deal with policy issues too much, we deal more in spending And I hadn't realized that, Senator Moore, that eight of the nine members of the Appropriations Committee had voted to advance the bill. I think that sends a signal that, if the people in this body that deal with higher education on a daily basis, have frustrations about the way it's coordinated, it is time for a change. The time is now. I think by voting down the bracketing motion you indicated you wanted to deal with it. I urge you to vote yes on the advancement.
