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SENATOR HEFNER: Time.

SENATOR LABEDZ: ...pro-life bill or pro-choice. Thank you.

SENATOR HEFNER: Thank you. Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator...Senator Labeledz, I will yield my time to you.

SENATOR HEFNER: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you. I just have very little more. I lost my place again. You need to be willing to accept that and issues like this are very emotional. They gut to...they get to the right to the core of many religious principles and many personal deeply-held beliefs and ideas, and when decisions are about to be made and those forces clash, you are going to have that type of response. For the most part, I want to say a particular thing that I was so pleased to see is when we had the hearings, when I say we, when the Legislature had the hearings on all the abortion bills, whether it has been the pro-life bill or the pro-choice or something in between, there would be a little bit of both at some point, all of a sudden both groups come together and testify pro or con, and you know people were real leery, really, really leery...I am reading exactly the transcript...because what was going to happen and Nebraskans that went to those hearings were great. They were very emotional, they were very sincere, but they were very respect...respectable of each other's viewpoints, and they followed the process, and each one got their voice heard. And it was a beautiful hearing as far as to watch a democratic process work.
