while it looks good when I read it over, I have some reservations about doing it on the last day when it has not, maybe, had a lot of scrutiny to see what the defects in it may be. Other than that, I think the proposal in general is sound, that we do need a coordinating commission with real power, but that we do not need to change the boards that govern those institutions, and I particularly like the fact that the tech colleges would also be involved here because there certainly is a problem in all postsecondary education including the tech colleges as in regard to coordination.

PRESIDENT: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do, and the question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Would the members return to their desks, please, we are on Final Reading, and we might get back into business here. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, on closing, but for those members not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, the issue before us at the moment is the suspension of the rule, and I can appreciate... in order to amend the Constitution, the proposed constitutional amendment today ... and I can certainly appreciate that there are those who were not aware of it.
