have...are trying to get off ADC and find meaningful employment and so many of those individuals who are affected by these programs do reside in Senator Chambers' district and those luncheons have been extremely helpful to us and have caused us to come forward with some of these programs, one of which is this program here today. So I would urge the body to override and go forward. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. And the question is the override of the veto involving domestic violence and ADC offered by Senators Ashford and Crosby. Those in favor of that action vote aye, opposed nay.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Call of the house, please, and a machine vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please return to your desks and record your presence. Those outside the Chamber, please return. Senator Ashford, please check in. Senator Rogers, please. Senator Landis. Senators Chizek and Robak. Senator Schmit, Senator Smith. Senator Landis. Senator Moore, please check in. Senator Abboud, Senator Schellpeper. While we're waiting, just a very brief announcement. It's not the Chair's purpose to curtail debate in any way but I would urge the members to use some restraint in discussing the motions to override and we are now looking at approximately 40 motions yet before us. It could be a long day. I would also ask members to stay close to the Legislative Chamber, please. It's ridiculous to have a call of the house time and time and time again. Thank you. Senator Ashford, did you ask for a roll call or did you not? Roll call. Members, return to your seats, please. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2018-19 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion fails. The next item, please. The call is raised.
