I'm more concerned, frankly, about the issue Senator Haberman brings us and would like to work on that any way I can, Senator Haberman, but I don't think I'm going to give you any money to do it. Sorry, but I'm going to oppose this just because I think it has a lesser priority than some of the other things that we have to deal with out there today and this is a total relatively small amount of money but it concerns me that this early in the stage we have already started an override process that I think I said earlier I'm going to be very selective in what I pick and choose and I know you are all too and this just doesn't happen to come up very high on the list. Thank you.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Senator Scofield. Senator Langford. Senator Langford is not at her desk. We will move on to Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Last light?

SENATOR LANDIS: No, you're not the last light. We have several more.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I would like to take this opportunity then to answer Senator Scofield. Senator Scofield, I am a little hurt and surprised that you will not support this expenditure as we could have a little Franklin out in southwest Nebraska because we have the same thing, foster care problems, child abuse, and that's costing \$300,000 just for one study. Are you listening, Senator Scofield? I said, Senator Scofield, with this study and with this money we're asking for we could possibly avert having a Franklin because the same things are going on there that are
