CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to cease debate.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Coordsen, to close.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. Only a short comment. I neglected to thank the Appropriations Committee for their recognition of the problem and including the funding for this. And, by the way, the Appropriations Committee, rightfully so, limited the funding recommendation for three years. This is the next fiscal year which they recommended 48,000, half of that was vetoed out. So I thank you all for your support and hope we carry through with this \$24,000 override. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the gubernatorial override of the chinch bugs, offered by Senator Coordsen. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted, if you'd care to vote? Record, please.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override that particular line-item veto.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion failed. Next item.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next item is by Senator Schellpeper.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Schellpeper, please, you are recognized.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. If you remember, back about two weeks, we had this very large spending bill for \$5,000. This is it, it's for a door at the university to be used for the antique farm machinery. I won't go into a lot of detail on it. I think it probably cost more to get the whole bill processed than it did to actually get the bill up here with the \$5,000. So, rather than have the bill be brought back again next year, I think we should just put the \$5,000 into it, because it would cost more than that to have the bill processed again. Thank you.
