The question is the override of the gubernatorial veto regarding antique farm machinery offered by Senator Schellpeper. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Why don't we just have a roll call vote on it and get it over with, one way or the other. Thank you. I'd have to have a call of the house, I guess, first in order to...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 1 may to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, return to your seats and check in. A roll call vote has been requested. Members outside the Chamber, please return. The house is under call. Senator Scofield, Senator Byars, Senator Lynch, Senator Dierks, Senator Schmit, Senators Haberman and Conway, Ashford, Senator Chambers, Senator Weihing, please record your presence. Senator Haberman. Senator Withem, the house is under call. Senator Schellpeper. Thank you, we will proceed with a roll call vote on the adoption of the motion offered by Senator Schellpeper. Mr. Clerk, proceed.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2023 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the override.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion failed. The Chair is pleased to note that Senator Bernard-Stevens has a guest under the north balcony, Dr. Clarence Ramsey, from Lincoln.
