SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: ...these figures take care of current lists. There are not going to be clients taken out of services with these figures. What Senator Coordsen is bringing to you is an additional, an additional...over all of this he's bringing an additional 2.225 million dollars to be placed in the budget with a rationale for which I have not yet been explained how this works out, but I do know that the regions don't enjoy this in any rational manner that is a way of distributing normal funds. It's an additional 2.225 million dollars that I can't understand how exactly it's being distributed. I think we pointed out to you that it doesn't need to be done. Services are not going to be taken away from existing clients. We have addressed some new waiting list people. We don't need this 2.225, we're going to be against the limit on the 3 percent reserve already. I would urge that you sustain the veto.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. And, Senator Hannibal, the Chair apologizes, I believe you have another member of your family with you under the balcony, a daughter. Would you care to advise us as to something that happened to your daughter yesterday that was especially nice at perhaps UNO.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Sure I would, Mr. Speaker. Is this personal privilege, or is this on my time, still? As a personal privilege, to make it official, I do have a daughter that is here. Her name is Sandra Hannibal, and she was installed into the National Honors Society about three days ago at Burke High School. Number two daughter was honored as being on the dean's list or the most outstanding person in her college, the College of Fine Arts, yesterday at UNO. And I have my...you heard about my number one daughter this morning who made us grandparents over the weekend, and my number four daughter is having a good time skiing at Winter Park. So that about covers it all right now.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Your time is up. (Laugh.) Would your daughter please stand and be recognized. Thank you. And following that commercial, the Chair recognizes Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Pass.
