SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Korshoj.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, that won't be necessary. We have no other lights. Senator Nelson, would you like to close?

SENATOR NELSON: No, I think everyone realizes the need, I hope, and with that, I will conclude.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the gubernatorial override of libraries, offered by Senator Nelson. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the override.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion failed. Next motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Coordsen would move to override the Governor's veto with respect to University of Nebraska greenhouses.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Coordsen, please.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, and members of the body. An override effort that doesn't cost any money. Let me turn to the page in the gold copy. On page 151, when the Governor's Office had the red pencil out, they not only vetoed the \$900,000 that I was successful in adding on the floor, or we were successful in adding, that would have been an appropriation, but they continued on and also vetoed the total amount of money that could be spent on this project. And that if you wanted to turn to page 5, they vetoed out the \$1,100,000 total project cost which has no bearing on appropriations at all, and put that back to \$1 million which is what we appropriated for the renovation last year. And we were somewhat successful in identifying some outside funds that would be helpful in renovating the greenhouse or continuing the greenhouse process separate from the \$900,000 that was taken out. So what this particular veto override is asking you to do is to put back into 1031 the intent language on the maximum amount of money that the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources can spend on the greenhouse renovation project but not add any General Fund money to this. So I am not trying to
