have gotten have included people who are interested in art from all over the state. For one thing, no one could see the art in the basement. There wasn't any place to crate it to send it out to other parts of the state for showing. They had no room you have heard my long, sad tale about room at Kearney State College. There was just plain no room. So we need the money to match the Kiewit matching funds, and that is ending June 30th. The people in town have gotten desperate. They have raised about as much money as our little town can give and the people from outstate that they have contacted, I can tell you one of the ladies who does the best job in this state of fund raising told me that the money is dried up. It has all gone into the Lied Center, and I believe that. So what we are asking you to do is give us a leg-up because otherwise we are not going to be able to restore the building. So far, everything that has been done has been done by volunteer help. The people from the college have gone down, they painted, they pulled out mail They filled holes in the marble floors, and they have reached the point now where they can't do any more. They need money, so I ask your indulgence. Thank you.
