And I think of, being a little philosophical, the thing I have learned in those 16 years is this, I don't try to make you over, I just accept you as you are. And that's the way it makes me happy and that's the way I like it and that's why I like you so much, I guess, because I just accept you for what you are. A few years ago, I wanted my wife to get me one of these, oh, my, hope I don't strain something, but she looked at them and they were too expensive and she didn't do it. And so I forgive you now, Ruth, for not doing that, and it's okay, because I think this is much nicer than the one we had in mind anyway. It is a beautiful statute of the sower and we will always keep it on our mantle and look at it and think about these wonderful days. In closing, may I say that the reason I have enjoyed this situation so much is that it's been so interesting; never the same. This session has been different than the last one. We went through various hard times this session but, as you look back, they were interesting, weren't they? And, as we look back three months from now or a month from now, we will wonder why we were so angry at times with each other about certain bills. So, ladies and gentlemen, I certainly thank you and appreciate it. Thank you. (Applause.) Senator McFarland, you have a motion. You may be seated, ladies and gentlemen.
