

the court injunction in the 4-R Act, and now if Congress should change the 4-R Act, that, in itself, will have an impact upon the rationale for the classification in part, but that hasn't happened. We are dealing with the law as it now exists, and it seems to me that it ought to be made permanent because unless it is changed it is, in fact, how it is, as far as the federal level is concerned. So I would urge that the amendment be adopted. If you want to pursue the issue of the sunset, that can be done with the amendment apparently that Senator Hall may be offering later, but I think it is exceedingly important that we do not go that route, but we can argue that on his motion.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Warner amendment to the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The Warner amendment is adopted. Shall we move on to the next section, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, I believe we have nothing further pending to that portion of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: We will go on to number 4, which is Section 3, correct? Senator Hall, please, any further discussion on that section.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, my understanding is that there is no amendment on these sections.

PRESIDENT: Pardon me.

SENATOR HALL: There is no amendment to these sections. This is just a vote on the sections listed, 4, 5, 6, and 11. This amendment is nothing, so that is what we are voting on, correct?

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, if there are no further amendments dealing with these sections, I assume under the division of the question, the motion that is in order is the adoption of the committee amendment as amended relative to the division of the question, Sections...
