

have no control over, but it is our entire personal property tax system. And until we address that system in its entirety, we will continue to be under attack whether we pass LB 7 or LB 77 or LB 777, I mean it makes no difference. We're going to continue to have that litigation before us year in and year out until we correct it. We have not done that. I would hope that the...would have hoped the sunset would provide for that. It is five, twenty-nine on November 15th. There are currently, at last count, 10 members of the body who are not present. I know full well that there is not support with 10 members, 20 percent of the body gone for this measure. I have no intention of holding the body here nor pushing the session beyond the Speaker's schedule, but I do want to go on record as saying that I think that without the sunset you are exactly sending the wrong message that we intend to send by what I thought was the reason we got called into session to get some clarification. With that, Mr. President, I would withdraw the amendment at this time.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. It is withdrawn. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?
