CLERK: 35 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider the bill's passage with the emergency clause attached.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion prevails. Back to reading for reconsideration of the bill on Final Reading. We're back to the main question before the body, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? Senator Lynch, your light is on. Did you...would you have a point of order?

SENATOR LYNCH: No.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Okay, this is not...

SENATOR LYNCH: I have been left out in the debate so far because I didn't get my light on in time. I just wanted to make sure I had a chance this time.

SPEAKER BARRETT: I'm sorry. We're proceeding to the vote now. You have heard the closing. We proceed immediately to the vote on the bill. Those in favor of the passage of the bill with the emergency clause attached vote aye, those opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the record vote. See pages 163-64 of the Legislative Journal.) 34 ayes, 10 nays, 5 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 7E passes. Anything for the record? Excuse me, Mr....or, Senator Warner, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, could I request a point of personal privilege?

SPEAKER BARRETT: State your point, please.

SENATOR WARNER: I seldom, in fact, I try never to look at a vote of an individual legislator as I assume all of us are voting our...what we believe is best and I accept that always. So I don't know who switched but, whoever it was, I want to express my appreciation for that.
