SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, Mr. President, members. I simply move that those recommended changes in the Retirement Systems rules be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK: We will now proceed to a board vote on this. All those in favor of this rules change vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of proposed Rules Committee amendment number one.

SPEAKER BAACK: Amendment number one is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lynch, as Chair of the Rules Committee, would offer amendment number two. (Second Rules Committee amendment can be found on page 163 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and members, the second rule change has to do with Rule 5, Section 4(c)(3). This section was put into Rule 5 when the Franklin Special Committee was, in fact, developed by this Legislature. The section provided that on January 4, 1990, this special committee would no longer exist. This section provided that this special committee could, in fact, in its own unique way, introduce legislation. Since it no longer exists, this section should no longer exist. And we simply move that Section 4(c)(3), from Rule 5, be removed.

SPEAKER BAACK: Is there any discussion? Seeing none, Senator Lynch, do you wish to close?

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman, I would move the adoption of the recommended rule change to striking obsolete language in Section 4(c)(3) from Rule 5.

SPEAKER BAACK: We'll now proceed to a board vote. All those in favor of the rule change vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Rules Committee amendment number two.
