Others won't. And I mentioned Senator Beutler by name because he and I will use each other for examples without either becoming too offended. Because if we get offended at that moment, we know there will be another moment when we can get even. But usually when we are clashing, something beneficial ultimately results from it. There is some kibitzing going on here which is in house and I am not going to repeat that for the record. I regret that the Legislature has, by a formal vote, thrown in the towel and said that it is so fearful of discussion, so fearful of an individual, that it has to adopt a rule that the Legislature, as a whole, not every individual, a majority of the Legislature hopes will stop that person from saying what he wants to say, knowing in front...now these poor freshmen, they don't know anything anyway. They think that they have done something. All they have done is been herded onto the wagon and trundled on to wherever you take people that you put in that situation. The Legislature, in the past under bludgeoning from the executive branch, has abdicated various portions of its responsibility in order to get along. That is one thing and it is undesirable. But when the Legislature, itself, votes to cut off one of its prerogatives, that is inexcusable. What you are going to find is that you've put a rule on the books which, in my opinion, makes the Legislature look very irresponsible and it won't have to be invoked. So you've committed a symbolic act but the symbolism is not positive as you think it is. It indicates that the Legislature, as a whole, fears debate. You listen to people who come around and tell you how terrible I am, you freshpersons, but as the session moves along, I'll bet more of you all will be coming to me more than you are going to go to some of these others who got you to stick your foot in that trap. And I will tell you why I am saying that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It may have the effect of working on your pride and ego to such an extent that when you have those difficult questions that I used to would actually give my time to try to puzzle my way through, and it will stop you from coming to me because you all won't want to hear me say, I told you so. It was a regrettable vote, and because that is added to these rules, I cannot vote to adopt these permanent rules. But for the freshpersons, I don't vote to adopt them anyway, because after people have voted to adopt them, they get up here, whine and then complaining about the nature of the rules, and then I
