CLERK:    30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 6.

PRESIDENT MOUL:    The motion carries, and LB 6 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:    LB 7, introduced by the Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred directly to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL:    Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER:    Madam President, members of the Legislature, this deals, as indicated in the handout, mental health commitment statutes. The current law, apparently, contains a provision which involves the court and, when the...I take it from the enactment of that legislation, a change was made and this particular section was taken out...was left in when it should have been taken out. This would then harmonize the statutes to reflect what the rest of the statute clearly states for the responsibilities or the actions of the mental health board. I move the bill be advanced, waive closing.

PRESIDENT MOUL:    Thank you, Senator Warner. We will proceed with the vote on the motion to advance LB 7 to E & R. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record the vote.

CLERK:    27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 7.

PRESIDENT MOUL:    The motion is adopted, and LB 7 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:    Madam President, LB 8, by the Chair of the Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT MOUL:    Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER:    Madam President, members of the Legislature, as indicated again by the title, the reference contained in LB 1153 was incorrect relative to a statute book. This makes the correct reference, and I would move the bill be advanced to E & R, and waive closing.
