PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. We will now proceed with the vote. All those in favor of the motion to advance to E & R please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 8.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted, and LB 8 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 9, introduced by the Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, referred to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, there is a couple in this. In Chapter 84 there are some internal references that are no longer accurate, those are corrected. The larger portion I will not completely go through, but it is the repeal of LB 84 that was enacted a couple years ago, and it's there because it had a termination date of July 15, 1990, which has, of course, expired. I would move the bill be advanced, and waive closing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. We will now proceed with the vote on the motion to advance LB 9 to E & R. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 9.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted, and LB 9 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 10, introduced by the Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, referred directly to General File.
