

January 16, 1991      LB 11, 12, 13

PRESIDENT MOUL:      Motion is adopted and LB 11 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 12 as offered by the Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred directly to General File, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL:      Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 12 does not repeal. It is a transfer of the...as indicated by the title, the section that covers multiple office holding and currently is assigned to article 5 of Chapter 32. This would transfer it to article 10 of the same chapter which will be a better assignment than where it currently is located. I'd move the bill be advanced and waive closing.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Warner. We now proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 12 to E & R. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Mr. Clerk, please record the vote.

CLERK:      30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 12.

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion is adopted and LB 12 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 13 introduced by the Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 10, referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, LB 13 repeals four statutes that deal with public lands and funds. Again, most of this is because of dates such as one of August 27, 1971. Another one is of August 30, 1987. In that particular case it was the transfer from the Normal School Endowment Fund to State College, Normal Fund which reflected the change in the title of those educational institutions. Others have a termination date of August of 1987, and in all cases the General Counsel for the Board of Educational Lands and Funds have looked at these four sections and concurs that they are
