

PRESIDENT MOUL: The motion passes and LB 106 is withdrawn.
Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Rod Johnson would move to
withdraw LB 177.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Johnson. Senator Johnson has not yet
arrived. He is excused. Is there someone else who is prepared
to handle this motion for him? We will now stand at ease. Item
number six on motions with Senator Johnson's motion to withdraw
LB 177. Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Thank you, Madam President. The purpose
for my withdrawal of this bill is that there is a (gavel)...it
is not that important, really. Senator Wehrbein and I have,
basically, sponsored the same bill or a very similar bill. So I
have, as a mutual interest, agreed to withdraw this bill and we
will be working together on his bill as well as some others that
