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early hearing or something, I don't know. But Senator Hall can explain it in a minute but we do have to have a suspension of the rules to do it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Speaker Baack. I now recognize Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam Chair. As Speaker Baack so aptly put it, this was a bill that was listed as for a hearing on, I think, Thursday of this week. The numbers were I think LB 82 and LB 83 interchanged. It was supposed to be, I think, LB 83. I think the listing has it as LB 82. The introducer preferred...it was our mistake. We went and asked the introducer if they would prefer...if they wanted that bill heard on Thursday. They said no. It is simply a change in the listing of the bill hearings. I would appreciate your support for a rule suspension so we can go ahead and make the switch. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. I will now recognize Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President, members of the body, would Senator Hall please yield to a couple of questions?

SENATOR HALL: Certainly, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Hall, does this bill have anything to do with Ak-Sar-Ben?

SENATOR HALL: No.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Does it have anything to do with the City of Omaha?

SENATOR HALL: Potentially.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Douglas County?

SENATOR HALL: Potentially.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, this is getting interesting at the beginning of the session, Senator Hall. Well, rather than to further question you and embarrass you on the floor, I will reserve my questions for later. Thank you, Madam President.
