SPEAKER BAACK: And this is very specific to boat dealers, the present bill is. And what you talk about with dealers using their plates in an unauthorized manner is a matter of enforcement of the law, not necessarily the way the law is stated. The law is simply not being enforced because they are not supposed to do that.

SENATOR NELSON: I might on the next reading, do a little more checking on the other trailers. I had a little problem, you know, in allowing it wide open, see, and I may check again on it. Thanks.

SPEAKER BAACK: Sure.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Nelson. Seeing no one else wishing to speak on this, do you have a closing statement, Senator Baack?

SPEAKER BAACK: Yes, Madam President and colleagues, I will just close by saying I think this bill is fairly well defined. I think Senator Lamb brings up a good point about whether or not it needs to be a yearly fee. I will check into that, see if it needs to be statutorily, exactly stated that it's a yearly fee. If not, if it does, I will do that on Select File. Senator Nelson, I'm sure, will be checking on the other ones whether we're opening something up here. I don't think we are. I think it's very clearly defined that we're talking about boat dealers and I know that boat dealers already now can get a permit to demonstrate boats, you know just a temporary kind of permit from Game and Parks where they don't have to license those so that they can demonstrate them, so they are...and I don't think that is being abused. I don't think that anyone is trying to use that on their own boats or anything. So I think that part of it is already in place and I think this is a good piece of statute that would allow some people in this state, that do business in this state, to do their business in a more efficient manner. So with that I would urge the advancement of the bill. Thank you.
