SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: It was better that way, for example, than mandate it. They tried other times to try to mandate it and quite nonestly, that was not acceptable to me or I think the body so they wanted simply to find out if it would work so they are going to try it in a couple of counties where they both agree.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Just for my information, what number bill is this.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: To be honest with you, I don't know what the number is. It is going to be in the 700s. I can find out in a minute.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, that's fine. Thank you, thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Pirsch. I'll now recognize Senator Morrissey followed by Senators Beutler and Lamb. Senator Morrissey.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Stevens, if you would, please. My questions can follow along Senator Hall's line. If I have...they have the option to not license my car so thus if that is what I drive to work, I can't earn money to pay these back taxes.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: If the county decided that that's what they wanted to do, if you had not paid a distress warrant, that could very well be the case. You would have to take care of the distress warrant before you got your license. That is correct.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: And they don't have to necessarily do that. They may or may not do that.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Both the county treasurer and the county sheriffs must agree to do so. They must get together and make a policy, yes, this is something in our county we want to try to do.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: They both must agree they want to try and do
