PRESIDENT MOUL: Senator Bernard-Stevens, do you still wish to speak on this? Senator Hall has also asked to speak.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam Chair. For the record, Senator Bernard-Stevens, I would hope that you would notice that I did not raise any of those issues. I only asked questions because I fully intend to offer amendments in the future and I just want to go on record, don't look at me with regard to how I'm going to vote in the future. Besides, I think the amendment probably was germane. It was just a little too early in the session. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hall. I will now recognize Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Madam President and members of the body, I just rise to support this bill. The Revenue Committee heard this bill the other day and I think it is a way that we can help some of these counties, and if we can make county government more efficient, I think we should do it and I believe this is the right direction to go and so I would encourage you to support this bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Hefner. Seeing no other senators wishing to speak on this motion, Senator Withem, do you have any closing remarks?

SENATOR WITHEM: I would, but I forget what the bill is about after all the other discussion here. This is a simple bill that changes the threshold on the two year to complete the serving of distress warrants instead of the nine-month period that is currently in existence. I would urge you to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Senator Withem. We will now proceed with a vote on the motion to advance LB 59 to E & R. All those in favor please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 59.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The motion is approved and LB 59 is advanced to E & R. Mr. Clerk.
