SPEAKER BAACK:    Thank you, Mr. Clerk.    We'll now proceed to LR 22.

CLERK:    Mr. President, LR 22, offered by Senators Lindsay and Hall, found on page 424 of the Journal.    Would you like me to read, Senator?    It's on 424 of the Journal, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK:    Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY:    Thank you, Mr. President.    Members of the body, this resolution is intended to commemorate James Paxson, who is, I guess, a prominent Nebraska Republican.    I don't think I can be accused of being particularly partisan on this resolution.    Mr. Paxson recently donated \$2 million to the Historical Society to build a museum, at the Gerald Ford birthplace, in Omaha.    As you all are aware, I'm sure, Gerald Ford was the only Nebraska born president of the United States, the thirty-eighth president.    There is a very nice place built up commemorating his birthplace, on 32nd Avenue in the 9th District.    The birthplace attracts quite a few people to come to it and take a look at it.    This will enhance that birthplace, it will provide a place to store and to exhibit some of the artifacts from the Ford presidency.    This resolution would simply commemorate Mr. Paxson and the Historical Society for that...using those funds and building that...building that museum.    I'd urge that the resolution be adopted.

SPEAKER BAACK:    Is there any further discussion on the resolution?    Seeing none, Senator Lindsay, do you wish to close?    He waives closing.    All those in favor of the resolution vote aye, opposed vote no.    Have you all voted?    Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:    28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 22.

SPEAKER BAACK:    LR 22 is adopted.    We will now proceed to Item 6 on the agenda which is a motion to withdraw LB 657.
