

January 29, 1991 LB 43, 61, 125

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move for the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 43.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: I move for the advancement of LB 43 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 43. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. LB 61.

CLERK: Senator, LB 61, I have no amendments pending.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move for the advancement of LB 61 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 61. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Proceed to Item 8, General File. LB 125.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 125 was a bill introduced by Senator Elmer. (Read title.) The bill was first introduced on January 10 of this year, referred to the Judiciary Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members, LB 125 is a repeat of LB 1003 from last year. LB 1003 was considered by the Judiciary Committee. A small amendment was included and was advanced to the General File unanimously by the Judiciary Committee at that time. Due to lengthy consideration of other bills ahead of it on General File last year, we got down to it, it was the next bill twice, but we adjourned before we could consider it and died at the end of the session. So this year's bill includes the committee amendments that were made last year and is the same bill. LB 125 would permit an individual who is
