Lancaster County, for 10 years, had been unconstitutionally charging and convicting citizens because it was a matter of them not being able to hire a lawyer to do what I was able to do. So, think of those 10 years of unconstitutional convictions that bothers nobody except me. That's part of the reason I take the time. So, the county attorney, proceeding with the vendetta, refiled the charge. We had a long afternoon trial on it. The judge, I call him "Default Williams", had been very irritated with me for filing various motions, so he was bound and determined he was going to find me guilty. So, you know how he did it? He referred to the exact, same unconstitutional language that had been stricken down 10 years before and that had been used by another judge to dismiss the original charge. So, as soon as he made that stupid blunder, I talked to the reporters about it, and said, this cannot stand. An article was done. The prosecutor, who had made all the blunders in the first place, got together with "Default" and said, we've got to straighten this out, call him back, change your decision so that you can get him again. Before they were able to do that, I filed my appeal. Once you file an appeal, it takes jurisdiction from the county court. I put that in a written motion to "Default Williams" and I appeared before him and made the argument. He denied and overruled the motions, said that makes no difference, and he changed his opinion, even though it was a violation of the law, and I put that in the appeal. So, the district judge said, as a matter of fact, as soon as a person files an appeal it takes away the jurisdiction from the county court. And, what "Default Williams", he didn't call him "Default Williams", what "Default Williams" did cannot stand, and dismissed it. And, now...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the prosecutor has filed it again for another trial. And they talk about not having money. I'm talking about a traffic matter. On a city ordinance in Lincoln, not very long ago, I was charged with an offense, and again I had to file my brief and a response to the city, and the judge dismissed that, too, because it had been improperly filed. Senator Beutler, if there is any instrumentality in this state that can criminalize conduct and put a citizen through these things that I have, personally, experienced and, did I not have the ability to handle it myself, I couldn't have afforded a lawyer, those instrumentalities should be held accountable so that citizens cannot be drawn before the bar of injustice, in
