SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, just so that the record is clear that I did, in fact, offer the amendment and the Clerk read it correctly. And I'm asking that it be adopted.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Is there any other discussion on the Chambers amendment? Seeing no request to speak, Senator Chambers, do you have a closing statement? Closing statement is waived. We will proceed to vote. All those in favor of the Chambers amendment to LB 135 please vote aye, all those opposed please vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment, Madam President.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The Chambers amendment is adopted. Is there anyone else who wants to speak on the motion to advance LB 135? Seeing none, do you have a closing statement, Senator Lindsay?
