I think you have a good bill. I know that Senator Cudaback is sincere. But I'm just anxiously awaiting the time when we begin to discuss bills that cost tens of millions of dollars and see if we find the same amount of reluctance to spend money at that point that we do here. There's one more point that I want to make and that is that jurors frequently, as has been pointed out here, serve at some sacrifice and there is some reason to believe that they should not have to publicly...or personally sacrifice to serve as a juror. I support the original bill.
