SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: The letters that are printed in the Journal that were sent to the two counsels, they were given a week, which will be...end at 5:00 p.m. on February 7th, I believe, in which those briefs are to be back. SENATOR WILL: Madam President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 82.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Is there anyone wishing to speak on this motion? Do you have a closing statement?

SENATOR WILL: Nope.

PRESIDENT MOUL: Okay. We'll proceed to vote on the motion to advance LB 82. All those in favor please vote aye...say aye.
