rates and that there's no time like the present to get those amendments and to put them on and cause the increases to occur immediately. I see no good reason to wait the 90 days. And, with that, this is the reason I put on the emergency clause.

SPEAKER BAACK: Any further discussion? I don't see any. Senator Kristensen, do you want to close on your amendment?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I would waive closing.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen waives closing...closing, clothing, closing, whew, whatever he waives. We will now proceed to a vote on the Kristensen amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kristensen's amendment.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen's amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I move that LB 37, as amended, be advanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER BAACK: You've heard the motion to advance LB 37. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. We will now proceed to General File and LB 17.
