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intended for farmers. My amendment does not restrict farmers from recovery. What Senator Ashford really was trying to say is that farmers sometimes don't show as much income, on their income tax, in his opinion, and thus they won't be able to recover as much. They are free to show all their recovery, they are free to show anything they want. I just want to be correct on that point. Do not be misled by saying that farmers are not going to recover under my amendment, because if that was true, I would not be here. You just don't make divisions of good law that way, based on who you are or what your profession is. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Next, Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, I have a question for Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER BAACK: Senator Kristensen, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: On the economic conditions, now that is joint and several, is that correct? For example, if...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes, yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...if I couldn't get it out of defendant one, I could move on to defendant two, and so forth, right?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Right, yes.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, now after that takes place, can those people continue to sue for pain and suffering?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: They can continue to try to collect their pain and suffering, but the...let's say one of those two defendants doesn't have any money, for one reason or another, can't be collected, the other defendant, they can only go after the percentage that the jury...

SENATOR ROBINSON: A percentage.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: ...gave to them as liability, that's all
