SENATOR SCHIMEK: Mr. President and members of the body, I hesitate to take any more of the body's time, and I will try to be brief, but I do feel that this is an important discussion that we're having. We've already had it in the Reference Committee on several occasions, and I believe that part of our conclusion to that discussion was that we need to revisit the rules and guidelines that we have established for referencing bills. Everybody acknowledges that some committees get too many bills, that maybe some of these bills that have penalties on them should, indeed, go to a committee other than Judiciary. But we decided that this year, since we haven't had time to examine those rules that were established some years ago by this Legislature, because we haven't had time, perhaps we should just go ahead and follow those rules and guidelines. I have to confess to you that I'm very torn because this really is a health issue bill. I also think the cigarette vending machine bill is a health issue and should go to Health Committee. And I have swayed back and forth as a member of the committee on what is really the right thing to do. I would caution us though that if we do this today and follow Senator Wesely's recommendation, that it might open the door to a number of other bills being brought before this body to be rereferenced. You could make a case for a lot of bills being health bills or others. So, I think the critical thing that we need to take the experience that we've been having over the last few years and take a look at our rules and guidelines. Maybe they are not as workable as when they were first introduced. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: The Chair recognizes Senator Schimek to address the motion, or Senator Chizek, I'm sorry. Senator Chizek.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Question.
