

a matter of fact, that there is improved policy in LB 88. What I do disagree with, however, is that you cannot isolate the impact of that from everything else. It seems to me in the past and this morning it was ruled as not germane, an amendment dealing with governmental subdivisions. It seems to me in the past that it was always argued that they couldn't be excluded when there was attempts to exclude them from any provisions covering the subject matter of LB 88. As we go along in the session and we will constantly have the argument of let's advance the bill and then we'll work it out on Select File or let's advance the bill to Final Reading and then we'll get it worked out. On a major bill that simply, usually doesn't happen. What you're doing every time you advance a bill is just eliminating, for all practical purposes, the opportunity to also take care of other issues that are affected by the legislation. It is my understanding from the discussion I've heard on the floor that this bill, 262 is appropriate as far as subject matter. They are used for some of the corrections in some of the statutes that would otherwise be affected if LB 88 is passed by itself, and since they are so interrelated and knowing full well, as everyone that has been here knows, when you advance a bill contingent upon correcting something in another bill, the odds of it happening is slim and each day of the session it becomes slimmer. On that basis I move the bill be bracketed until those two bills can be worked together. You can't separate the policy from its impact and I think it would be much more orderly for members of the Legislature, particularly those of us who are not as familiar with the legal issues that are involved here, if we have an opportunity to see how the two areas work together rather than isolating one from the other. With that I would move that bill be bracketed until 262 is up on the board and can be considered so we can understand the total impact of this legislation and not deal with it when one aspect of it isolated from another and in all probability never even have a chance to address it.
