If that were under that logic, every bill that deals with agriculture would have to be heard on one week and every bill that had to do with environmental issues would have to be heard during one particular time and that just isn't, doesn't particularly make any sense. The immunity issue is an issue that will be debated on this floor and it will be debated in LB 262 and everyone will have an opportunity to debate that issue on one side or the other. The joint and several liability bill, LB 88, will I am sure, will have more debate on Select File. Hopefully Senator Kristensen and I can continue to work and bring something to the body that we both agree on. But I think for the first time in the history of my tenure here we have got these issues where they belong, segregated into the pockets where they belong and we've got, at least Senator Kristensen and myself and Senator Conway, and thanks to Senator Chizek in bringing us together, the opportunity to maybe make some sense out of all of these issues and bracketing would just not lend anything to that process. So with that, I would urge that the body reject the bracket motion. Thank you.

SPEAKER BAACK: Thank you, Senator Ashford. Now we go to Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call the question, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BAACK: Do I see five hands? I do. We will now proceed to vote. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BAACK: Debate has ceased. We will now proceed to Senator Warner to close on your bracket motion. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Well, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the...as I understand the commitment as it has been described is that LB 262 will be advanced from committee and the Legislature will have an opportunity to address the issues, and I appreciate that commitment, and there is no question in my mind that what it will be honored. What I didn't hear...my problem doesn't rest with the ability to address the issue, it's how the issue is resolved affecting governmental subdivisions that I'm concerned about. And if LB 88 moves on across the board and 262 is promptly reported out and all the things, but then it gets bogged down where the issues aren't resolved and
